LETTERS FROM KARELIA (76 mins.) (2004) by Kelly Saxberg

This remarkable film is based on the untold story of nearly 1,000 idealistic young Canadians who disappeared in the Stalinist Soviet Union of the 1930's; at least 600 of them who ended up in a mass grave. Many Finns left their home to build a Communist inspired worker's paradise in Karelia in North Russia. (CFI) This story revolves around Aate Pitkanen, a young Canadian of Finnish heritage who left Thunder Bay in 1931 to settle in Karelia. He was caught in 1942 and executed but before he died he wrote a series of letters to his relatives in Canada. Sixty years later, these letters were found by Jukka Lehesvirta, a journalist in Helsinki. The letters were sent to Canada where Aate Pitkanen's relatives including his 90 year old sister were astonished to learn the details of Aate's death and that he had a son, Alfred Pitkanen. **Regular Admission**

Victor Jara was a Chilean folksinger/songwriter who dedicated his art to the Chilean/Latin American people. His music was part of the struggle, hopes and dreams of the people. He was part of that great political/musical movement of the 60's and early 70's, that managed to elect Salvador Allende as President of Chile. Victor Jara's songs, talk about the daily life of workers, peasants, women as well as their aspirations and desire for a better future. He was well known in Chile and Latin America because of his songs had a commitment for change.

In one of his songs he said: "I don't sing for love of singing / or to show off my voice / but for the statements made by my honest guitar / for its heart is a bird / and like the dove it goes flying / tenderly as holy water / blessing the brave and the dying / so my song has found a purpose / as Violeta Parra will say".

He was assassinated by the military regime in September of 1973 when Augusto Pinochet Ugarte ended democracy in Chile.
