One worker out of 15 is injured at work. One worker out of 32 is injured severely enough to miss at least one day of work. Three occupational fatalities occur every working day.



OUT ON THE STREET PREMIERE

The union members of IATSE Local 63 struggle for the stagehand jobs at the MTS Centre, Winnipeg's new sports and entertainment facility—jobs they were told were theirs after having worked at the Winnipeg Arena for fifty years.

This is the premiere of filmmaker Aaron Floresco's documentary, a film that follows the members of IATSE 63 and their fight through the courts, conciliation, informational pickets, and boycotts to secure stagehand work at the MTS Centre—and chronicles one of Winnipeg's most contentious workers' rights stories in recent history. The film also examines the decline of unions in Canada's private sector employment pool, as an increasing amount of jobs are contracted out through temp agencies.

In 1996-97, a new art culture sprang up that rejected the tradition of critiquing and pricing art. Swiss artist M. Vanci Stirnemann is hailed as the father of the Artist Trading Card (ATC) movement. Stirnemann, inspired by hockey trading cards, created and showcased 1200 similarly-sized cards in his gallery in Zurich, Switzerland. He told people who wanted one of his cards to come back and bring one of their own in trade—and a movement was born.

Rick was known for his many accomplishments in the world of theatre and the performing arts. He also played an important role in the first years of the MayWorks Festival. He personified the MayWorks theme: "Celebrating Labour and the Arts". Rick was dedicated to progressive politics and the belief that artistic expression should be used to give form to those politics. As part of MayWorks 2005, he produced the play King Leopold's Soliloquy, based on Mark Twain's 1905 pamphlet condemning Belgium colonialism in the Congo. In 2006, he joined the MayWorks Board to contribute to the process of bringing the Festival to a new and wider audience. His energy, talent and enthusiasm will be deeply missed.
